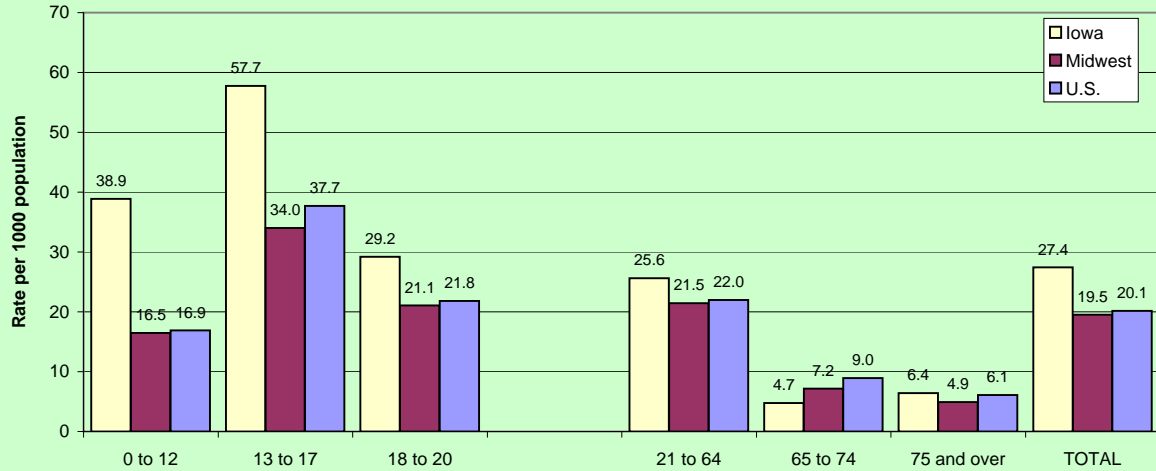

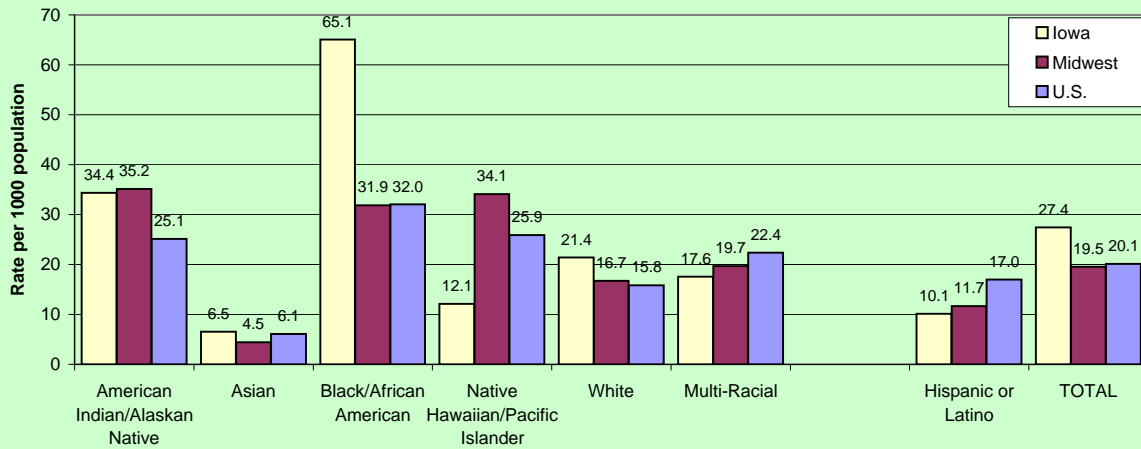

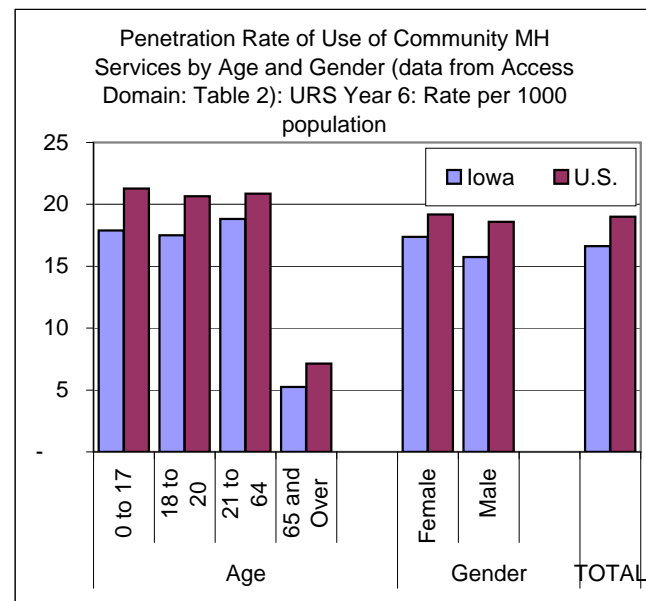

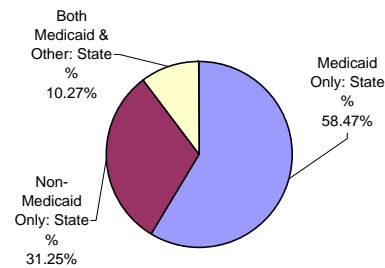

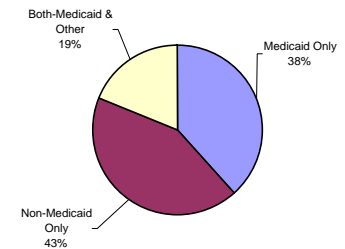

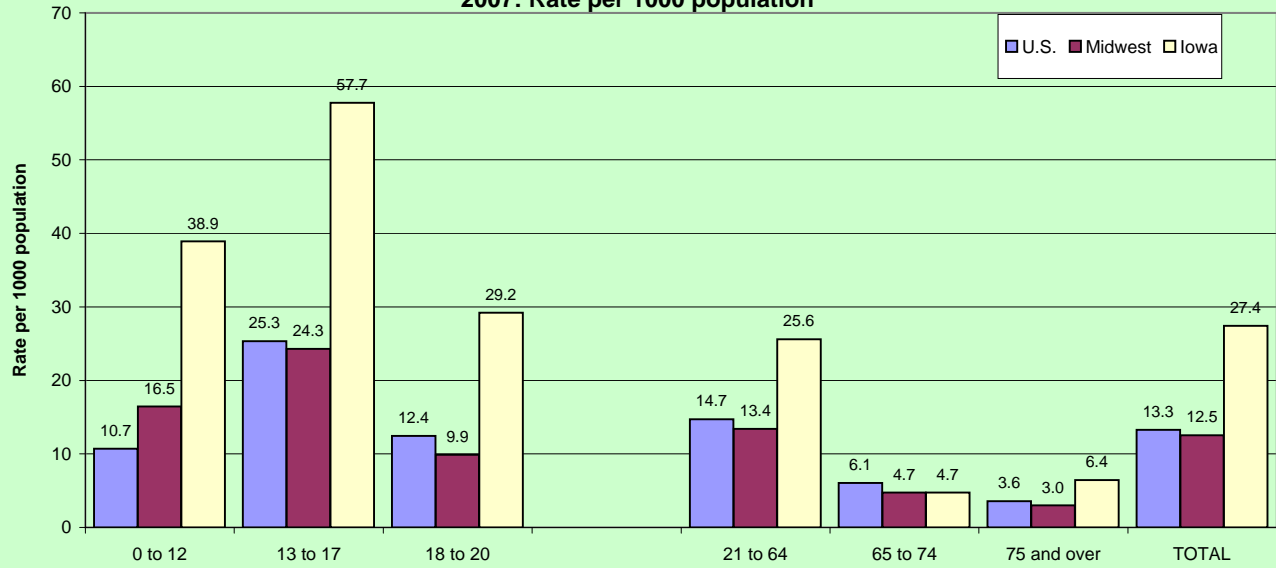

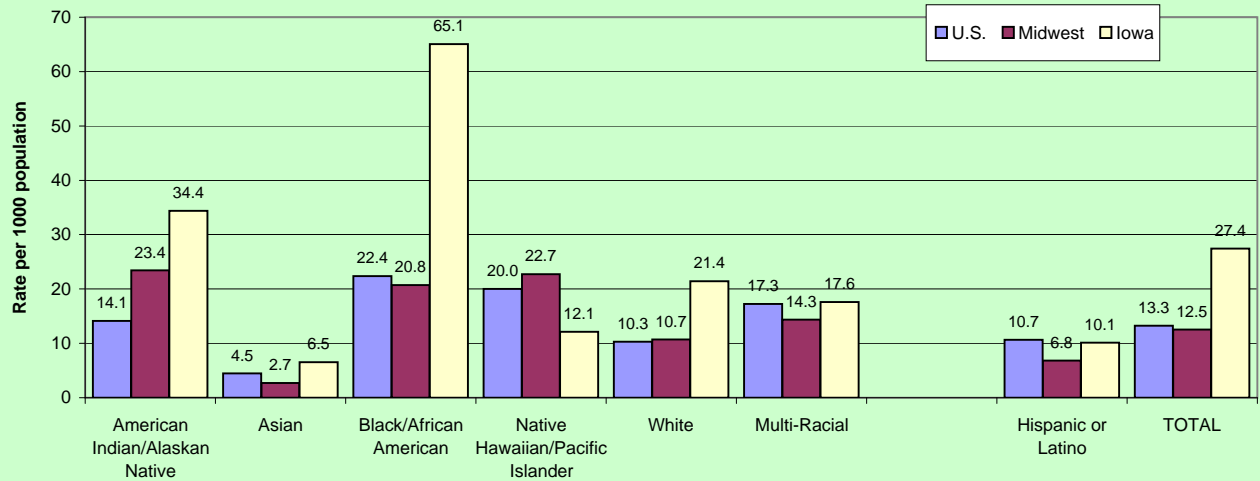

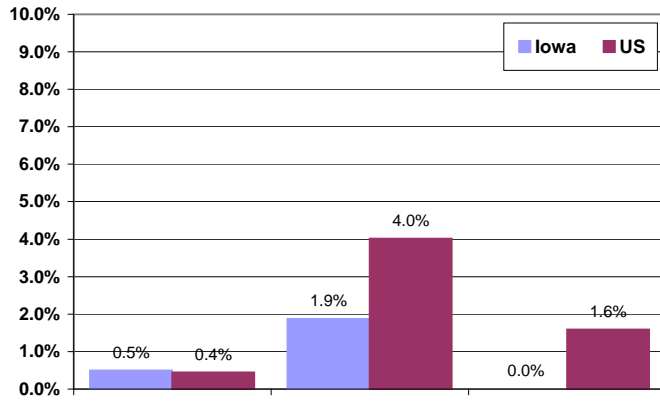

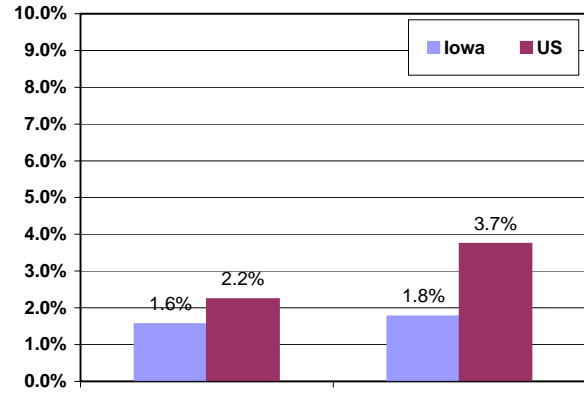

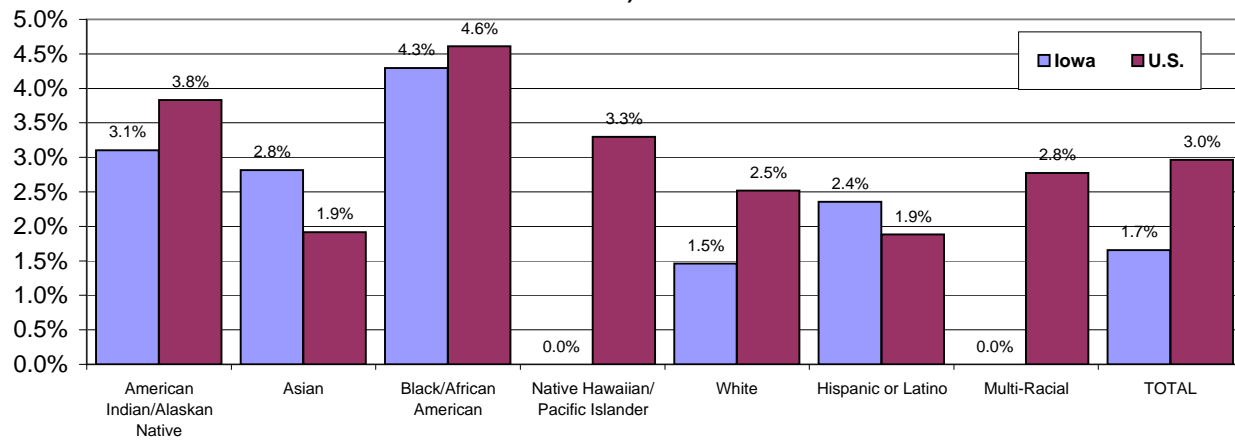
Percent of Persons Served in MH Programs who were Homeless, by Age (data from Appropriateness Domain: Table 5): Year 6

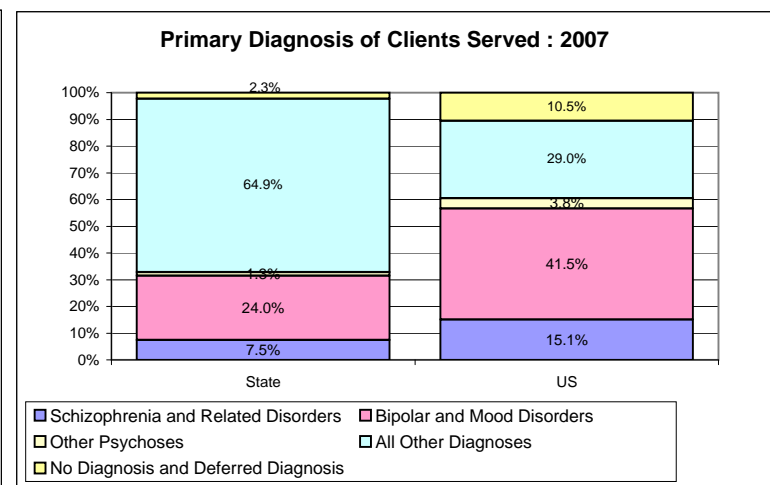

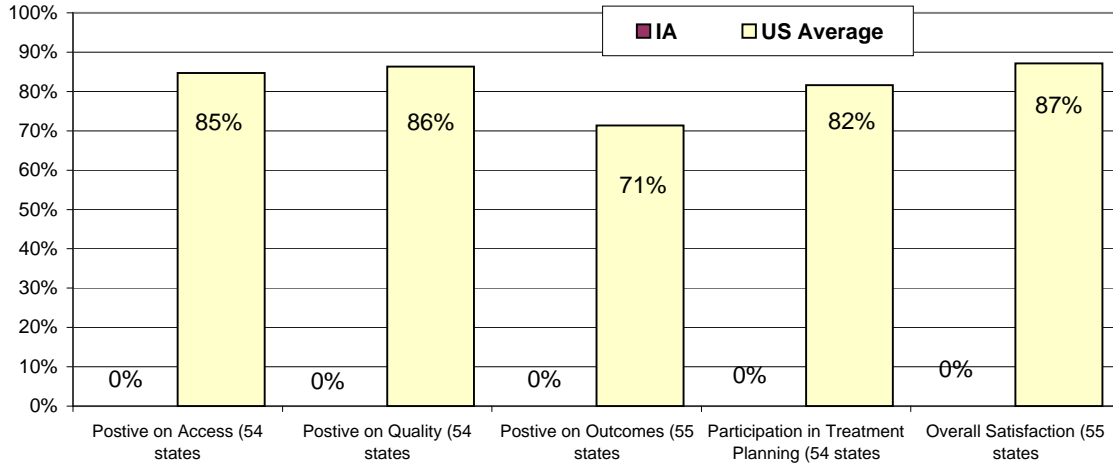

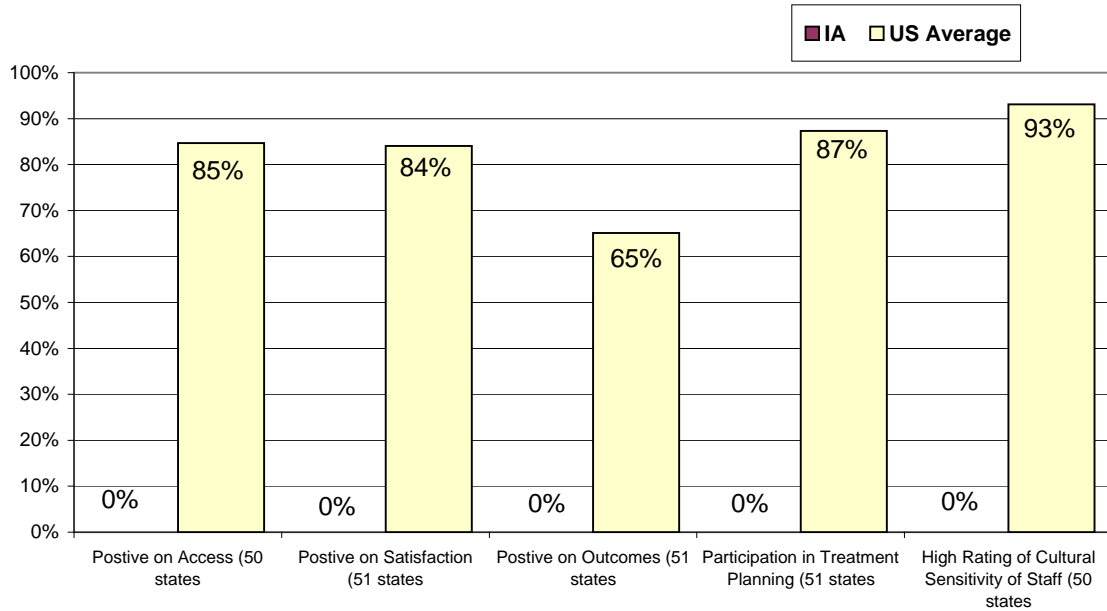

In addition, people with chronic mental illness typically meet at least two of the following criteria on a continuing or intermittent basis for at least two years: 1. They are unemployed, employed in a sheltered setting, or have markedly limited skills and a poor work history. 2. They require financial assistance for out-of-hospital maintenance and may be unable to procure this assistance without help. 3. They show severe inability to establish or maintain a personal social support system. 4. They require help in basic living skills. 5. They exhibit inappropriate social behavior that results in demand for intervention by the mental health or judicial system. In atypical instances, a person who varies from these criteria could still be considered to be a person with chronic mental illness.
