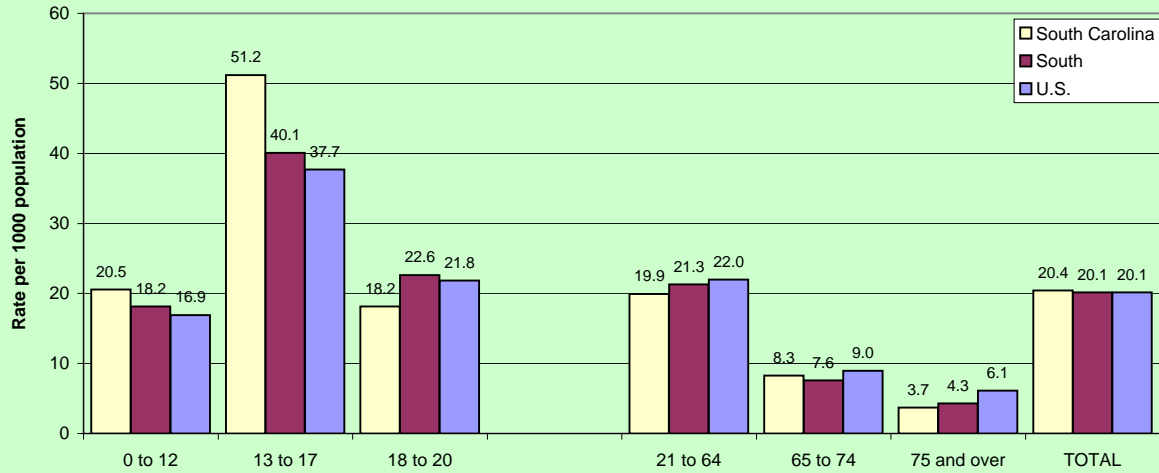

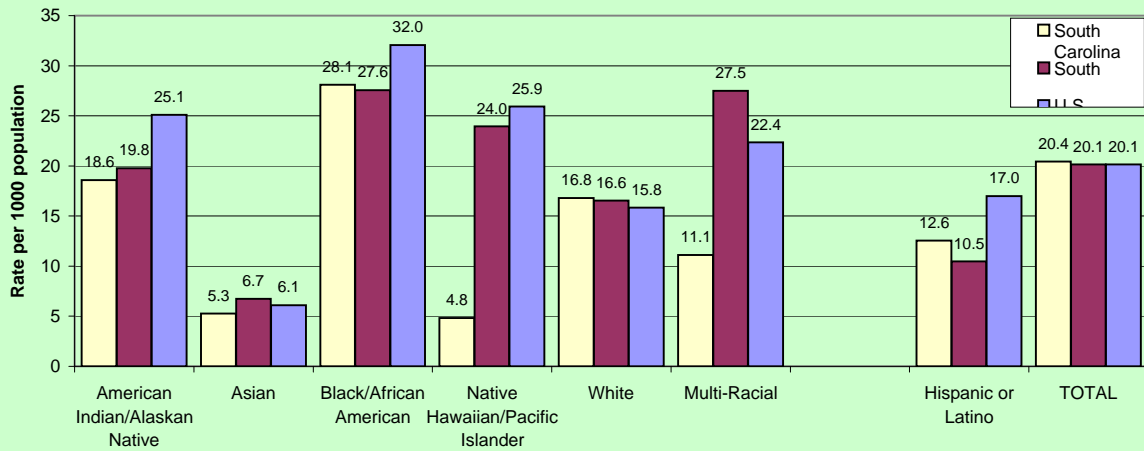

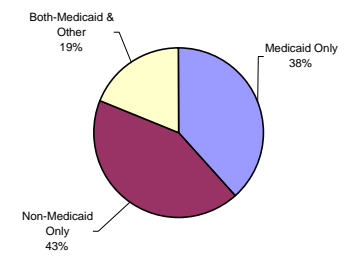

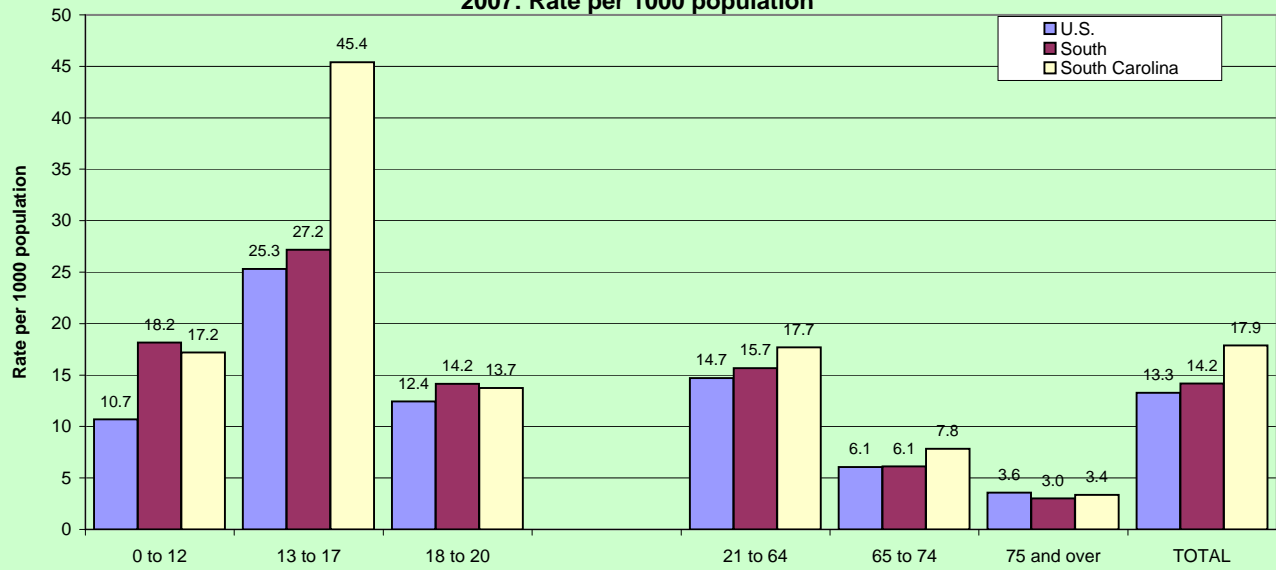

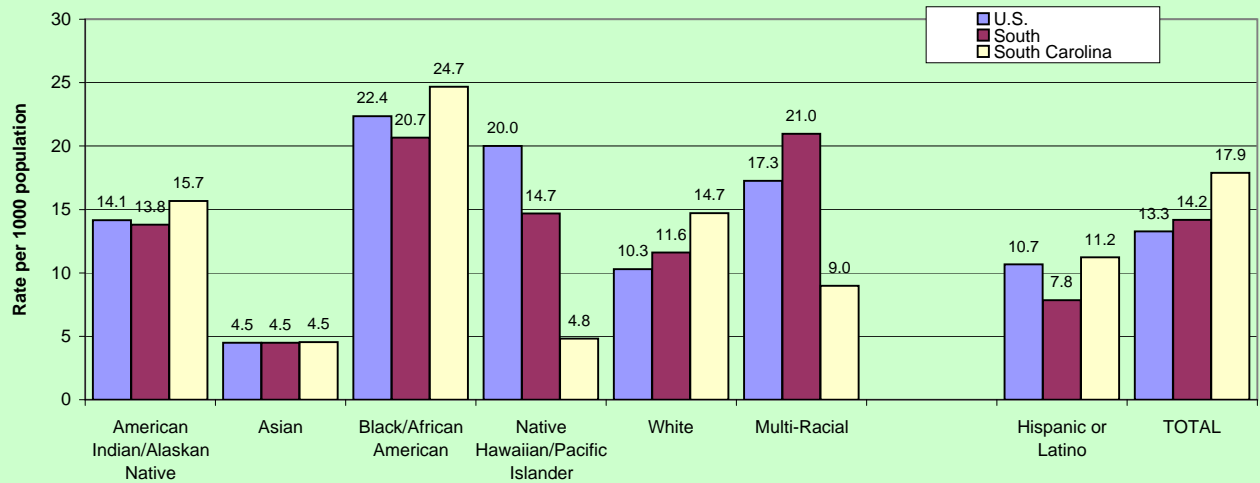

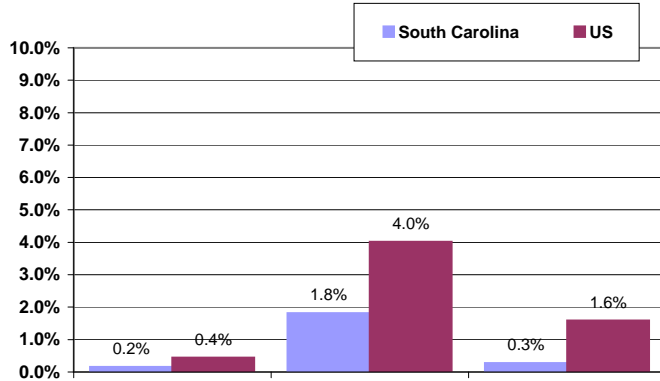

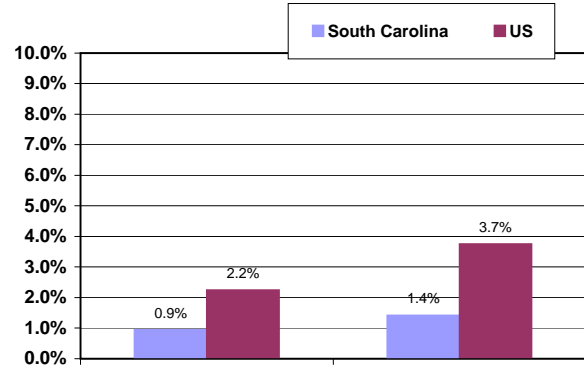

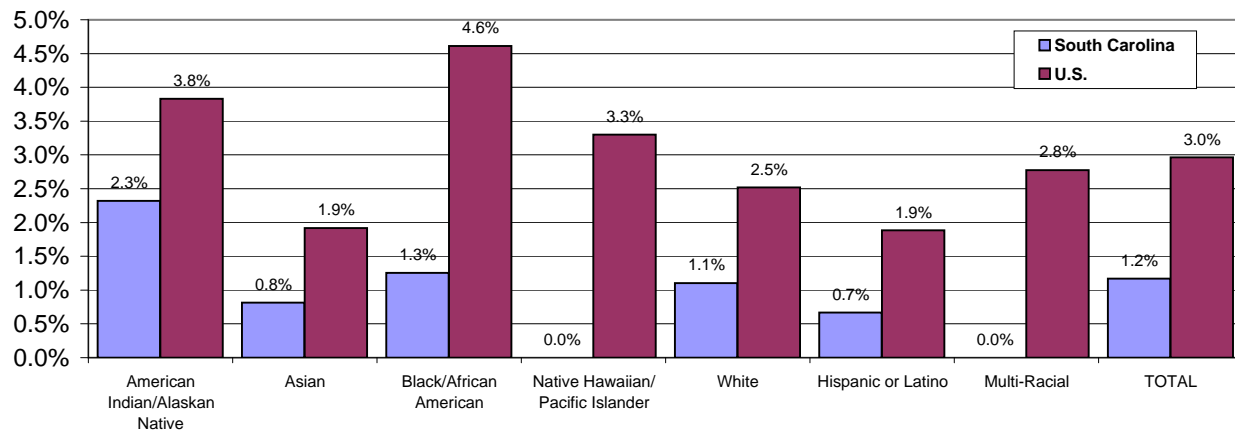
Percent of Persons Served in MH Programs who were Homeless, by Age (data from appropriateness Domain: Table 5): Year 6

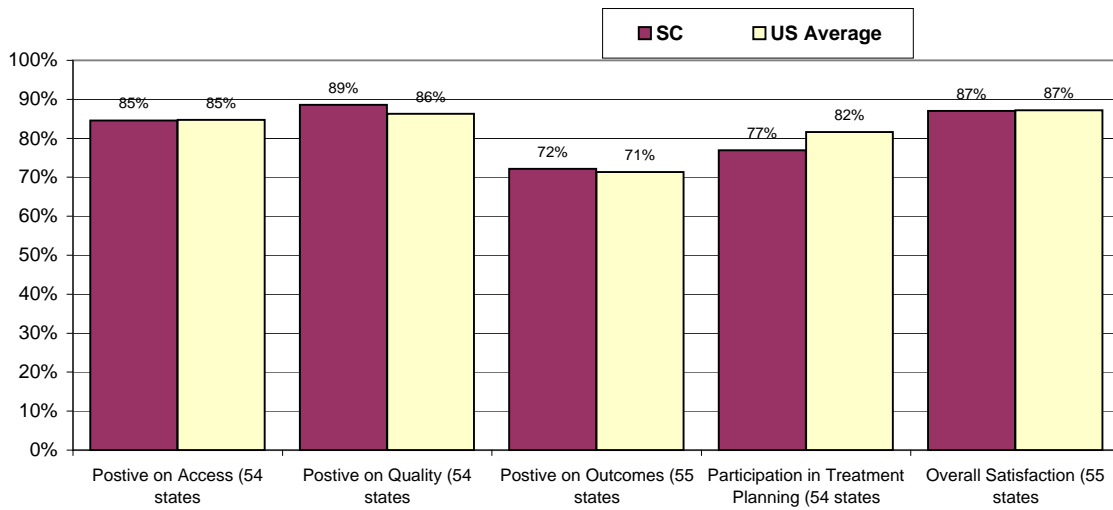

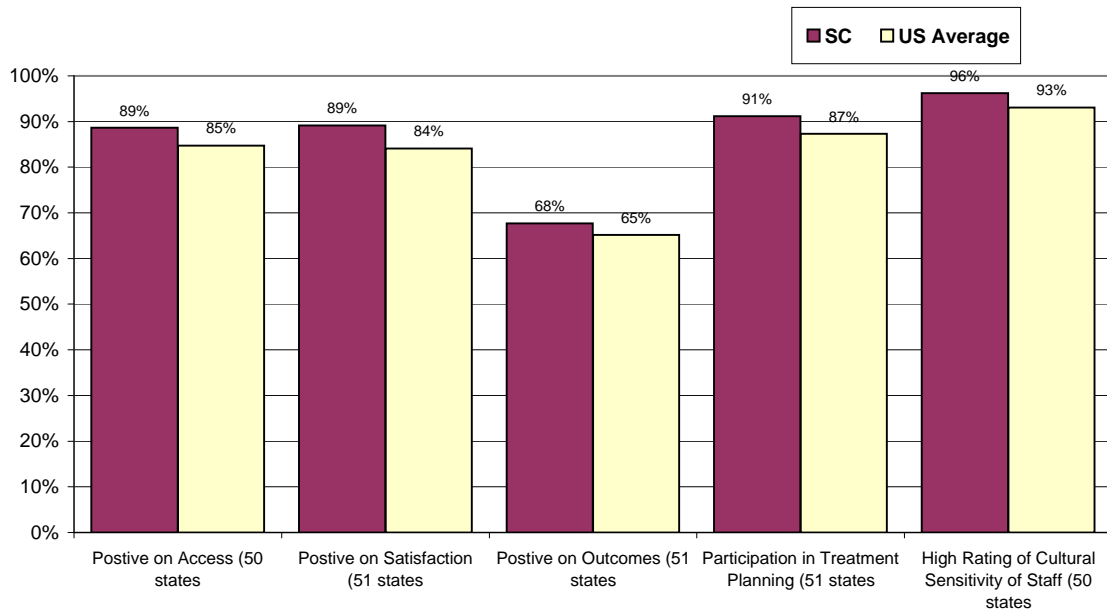
