FY08 is the first complete year we are able to report on community program data through AKAIMS. Due to unexpected circumstances and an extremely high workload on our AKAIMS programming staff, we were not able to develop the customized extract programs needed for complete reporting in the URS Tables. We were able to report the total unduplicated count of "clients served" and "SMI/SED clients served" using our AKAIMS report for clients served during the quarter - FYTD totals. These totals reflect the unduplicated count of clients receiving services through program enrollment; this is not an unduplicated count of clients receiving any mental health service including screenings, assessments, face-to-face crisis services, and services through program enrollment. Thus, the numbers reported for community program services are significantly lower than actuals.</p> <p>The AKAIMS totals for clients served (through program enrollment) were supplemented with demographic and funding data from STARS/MMIS (note: no demographic data is reported for SED youth served).
