14	Children and adolescents with a serious emotional disturbance are defined as any individual, from birth up to age 21, who meets one of the eligible diagnostic categories as determined by the DMH and the identified disorder has resulted in functional impairment in basic living skills, instrumental living skills, or social skills. The need for mental health as well as other special needs services and support services is required by these children/youth and families at a more intense rate and for a longer period than children/youth with less severe emotional disorders/disturbance in order for them to meet the definition's criteria.
