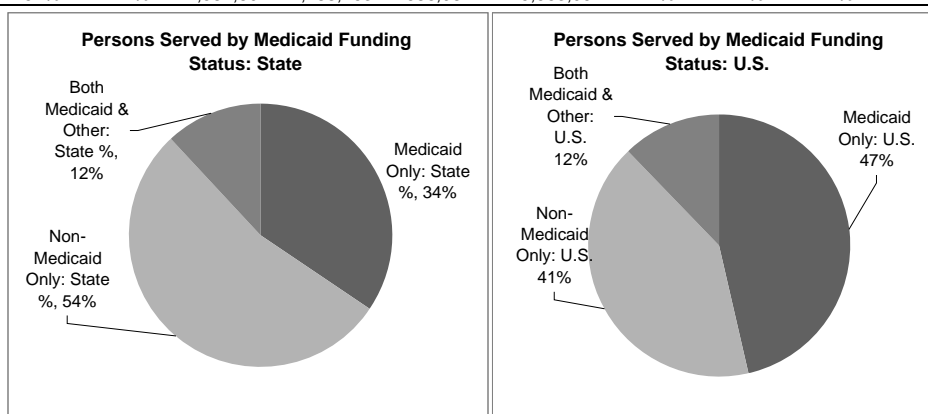

This is due to a change in procedures and improvements in data quality. After intensive analysis of service patterns in Medicaid claims and encounters, project analysts revised the methodology used to annualize the one week survey data . Note also that the confidence interval for the annual estimate has widened for 2007 through the use of more accurate probabilistic techniques (Laska, Meisner, Siegel, Biometrics, June 1988) based on empirical mental health data.
17	The Family Psycho-Education estimate includes 100 persons receiving services under the Macfarlane Multiple Family Group model and 1500 consumers receiving Consumer Centered Family Consultation, a brief 1-3 session intervention that emphasizes information, support and guidance to family members that is practical and applicable to more adults with SMI. For Wellness Self-Management, fidelity is assured via the Practice Fidelity Measure, "Educational Supervision of WSM: Core Competencies Checklist".
