11	Mississippi utilizes a supported mail procedure in implementing the satisfaction survey process. Since we did not mail or call individuals, but instead, had surveys delivered to them (supported mail) to allow the purpose of the survey and other consent information to be explained to potential respondents, we calculated the response rates based on the number of surveys sent out to the local level (i.e., sample size). Although distribution logs were suggested for tracking the number of surveys at the local level that were actually delivered, these logs were not submitted to the state level. We are considering requiring that the number of surveys actually delivered be reported to the state level; however, in the meantime, Mississippi erred on the conservative side in calculating its response rate (i.e., the response rate might have been higher than reported).
14A	Mississippi's definition of serious mental illness among adults as currently defined in its Minimum Standards for Community Mental Health/Mental Retardation Services is very similar to the federal definition, except that it references DSM IV (or subsequent editions) and further defines the functional impairment component to include "functional impairment in basic living skills, instrumental skills or social skills, as indicated by an assessment instrument/approach approved by the Department of Mental Health." The federal definition is also consistent with individuals reported as served through the psychiatric hospitals, with the only probable exclusion for adults being personality disorders, which are coded on Axis II.
14A	Mississippi's definition of serious emotional disturbance among youth as currently defined in its Minimum Standards for Community Mental Health/Mental Retardation Services falls within the federal definition, except that it references DSM IV (or subsequent editions) and allows eligibility up to 21 years of age (to include transitional-age youth); however, for reporting URS Table 14A, only those youth with SED up to age 18 are included. Mississippi's SED definition also includes a requirement that the identified disorder results in a "functional impairment in basic living skills, instrumental living skills, or social skills, as indicated by an assessment instrument/approach approved by the Department of Mental Health."
15	Data for URS Table 15 is collected as part of a core data set defined in the MS DMH Manual of Uniform Data Standards and to date, has been submitted in aggregate reports to DMH for subsequent submission to NRI; information on living situation is typically collected as part of the intake/initial assessment process. The DMH will have capacity to report living situation data through its central data repository when all providers can submit data that meets edit criteria.
16	Supported Housing: The federal definition of supported housing as an evidenced based practice in URS Developmental Table 16 is similar to what is referred to in Mississippi as "supervised living." DMH will continue activities through its Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG) Quality Improvement project to examine the similarities and differences in state and proposed service definitions, including the issue of data collection for supported housing. DMH has continued activities through its Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG) project that included work on the central data repository. These activities allow for reporting of supported housing services when they are available and when fidelity is established.
16	Supported Employment: The DMH has continued to collect/report information on the number of individuals served in transitional employment programs, as defined by the state. DMH will continue activities through its Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG) Quality Improvement project to examine the similarities and differences in state and proposed service definitions, including the issue of data collection for the evidence-based practice of supported employment. DMH has continued activities through its Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG) project that included work on the central data repository. These activities allow for reporting of supported employment services when they are available and when fidelity is established.
16	The DMH has been continuing activities to plan and pilot implementation of ACT, which began with seeking education and technical assistance, including technical assistance provided by Oklahoma's ACT program staff in Mississippi in 2005. Since that time, DMH Division of Community Services staff has visited with staff of the VA Hospital's ACT team in Jackson, and staff from Region 15's community mental health center have visited the ACT team in Little Rock, Arkansas (in March 2007), and the DMH sent a team (that includes regional staff that participated in the PCP project) to Oklahoma at the end of FY 2007 to obtain additional, follow-up technical assistance regarding implementation of ACT. After that visit, an ACT Steering Committee met, and work has continued with the Division of Medicaid to develop a proposed State Plan Amendment and/or waiver for submission to the CMS that, if approved, would facilitate changes in community-based services to further support recovery. Currently, plans are proceeding to train a local service provider team that will begin piloting of an ACT team using state funds in one community mental health region in FY 2010. DMH has continued activities through its Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG) project that included work on the central data repository. These activities have led to the establishment of new codes for reporting of evidence-based practices, including ACT, which will allow for reporting of ACT services when they are available and when fidelity is established.

16	As mentioned in the specific objective on therapeutic foster care (described in the Implementation Report and State Plan), in accordance with federal URS table reporting instructions, the DMH is currently reporting the number of children receiving evidence-based practices in programs receiving funding support from the public mental health agency. Additional youth receive services through therapeutic foster care programs certified, but not funded by the DMH. Youth also receive Multisystemic Therapy (MST) services through a nonprofit program that is certified, but not funded by the DMH and therefore, those data are not included in the EBP table at this time. DMH does not currently provide funding specifically for Family Functional Therapy; therefore, data is not available on the provision of FFT.
16	Initiatives to promote implementation of other evidence-based practices for youth and families, such as the Learning Collaboratives for trauma-focused cognitive behavior therapy described in the State Plan have also continued, as have local initiatives, such as: Region 12 CMHC and Region 13 CMHC have organized workforce training in trauma-focused CBT, CBT and Combined Parent Child CBT for all of their children's therapists, and evidence-based practices for youth are being implemented through the local System of Care project in Region 12.
17	As described in the State Plan, currently, the MS DMH supports NAMI-MS in the provision of the Family to Family program, which reports the number of persons trained and the educational contacts made through that program. "Family psycho education" is an evidence-based practice included in the CMHS National Outcome Measures, the proposed definition of which is similar to the components used in the Family to Family Program. In accordance with current CMHS Reporting Guidelines for Evidence-based Practices (URS Table 17), DMH reports data for the NAMI Family-to-Family program, with notation that it is not the EBP for family psychoeducation. DMH will continue to monitor availability of additional information on the effectiveness of the Family to Family program from ongoing research activities.
17	As noted in the State Plan, structured programs that include the NAMI Peer to Peer training and Mississippi Leadership Academy are made available to facilitate the development of consumer education and support groups throughout the state. Consumer education programs provide individuals with education about their illness, including coping skills, and facilitate individuals taking a more active role in their recovery. The programs also provide information about how to access and advocate for and about opportunities for the development of self-help groups. Staff in the DMH Division of Consumer and Family Affairs will consult the EBP Toolkit as another resource to facilitate implementation of recovery-oriented services and supports for consumers.
