ND's multiple independent data systems used for a variety of purposes such as billing, eligibility, progress notes, scheduling, etc., with data collection being one piece. 14A & 14B	In SFY 2008, an electronic checklist was implemented as a guide to assist case managers with identifying individuals receiving services who meet the definition of serious mental illness. Implementation was 10-24-2007. The checklist data was designed to be used as a means to identify the number of records in the system for adults diagnosed with serious mental illness. A decrease of approximately 4,000 adults was found from SFY2007 to SFY2008, so a change in methodology was implemented in attempt to account for the discrepancy. The methodology for reporting the number of individuals with SMI who received services at the regional human service centers has again changed from the previous years, and the methodology used in SFY2008. SFY2009 is the baseline year for reporting the number of adults diagnosed with SMI, using only the aforementioned electronic checklist. It is suspected that the number of individuals who receive services at the regional human service centers has been over reported in the previous years. It is also suspected that the SMI electronic checklist is truly reflective of the number of adults diagnosed with SMI, though it will need to be monitored. If 3,325 adults with SMI received services in SFY2008, based only on the SMI checklist data, the penetration rate is 33.46%, compared to 70.38%. For SFY2009, based on the SMI checklist data, 3,437 adults with SMI received services, with an estimated population of 9,969 adults with SMI in need of services, for a penetration rate of 34.38%. These numbers appear to be more consistent with information reported from other states of similar size and make up. In SFY 2007, a similar checklist was implemented for youth diagnosed with SED. Data has been collected from the youth checklist with no discrepancy from the previously used methodology. These changes in methodology account for the noted differences between the data reported in SFY 2009 and previous years for this indicator.
15	Consumers who are Homeless or in a Shelter living arrangement data is only collected at admission. It could be hypothesized that more individuals received services at the regional human service centers in SFY 2009 due to being affected by flooding and other weather related disasters in ND, which rendered them without a home. Anecdotal, because of the recession around the country, and the fact that ND weather the recession very well, a number of people came to ND looking for employment. This also could have impacted homeless numbers as people came to the state without having housing arranged, and were thus homeless.
16	PATH=PATH, Inc. of North Dakota. Data from Therapeutic Foster Care is collected separately from the Community Mental Health Data, from which the Children with SED numbers are derived. There is ongoing work to combine the data from the separate data systems. Data reported for the Number of Adults Receiving Supported Employment Services is also collected separately from the Community Mental Health data, from which the Adults with SMI numbers are derived. With data being collected from separate, independent data systems, there is room for error in reporting, as noted with the discrepancy between the number of "not available" adults under supported employment and the total number of adults with SMI receiving services by "not available."
