6	<p>There is a 40% increase (from 2009) in the average LOS of children (in facility less than one year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year. There are multiple reasons that may account for this increase. DMH contracts with community hospitals to provide inpatient treatment for most children/adolescents for whom services are purchased. As a result, the size of state hospital units that treat these individuals are being decreased or closed. Forensic cases that have longer length of stays may make up a greater proportion of the admissions resulting in a longer average LOS.</p>
