4	2009 to 2010 decrease in number of consumers unemployed is due to the new database application allowing "not available" and "unknown" to be reported. For employment status, there has been over an 80% increase in use of these responses. Application edits to prohibit the use of "not available" and "unknown" are planned for July 2011.
5	Increase in number of consumers with Medicaid over 2009 number is the result of placing significant emphasis on accurate Medicaid information being submitted to the mental health community database. Beginning in July 2010, authorization for Medicaid Rehabilitation Option (MRO) services is dependent upon Medicaid number, date of birth, diagnosis, and assessment being entered into the mental health community database. These data elements are used to determine MRO eligibility and the array and amount of MRO services a consumer is authorized to received within each six month period.
5	2009 to 2010 decreases in number of consumers with non-Medicaid funding and both Medicaid and non-Medicaid funding are the result of more accurate Medicaid information and the use of "unknown" and "not available" responses in the new state mental health database application.
6	Lower number of persons at beginning of the fiscal year is related to implementation of new database, slow migration of data from two legacy systems to one system, and identification of significant duplication issues in the old systems. These situations also caused the increase in admissions during the fiscal year. In cleaning up data post migration, most providers better managed admissions, discharges, readmissions during the year resulting in higher number of admissions added to number at beginning of year.
6	Lower number of persons admitted to other psychiatric inpatient units during the year is probably not accurate as many providers had significant challenges in submitting their encounter data to the new database. Calculation of inpatient admissions is from CPT codes in the encounter files.
6	Increased admissions to residential treatment centers during the year is probably more accurate than in previous years since providers improved reporting reassessment information which includes the living situation for youth.
11	Indiana used a convenience sample methodology for the MHSIP and YSS-F surveys in 2010 and calculated required sample size at the statewide level. Previously, the state utilized a telephone contact methodology through a state university contract and the sample size was based on the number of surveys needed for a 95% confidence level for each local provider.
11a	In creating the survey forms for the convenience sample, Indiana inadvertently left out the race/ethnicity designations. Therefore, no race/ethnicity data is available for the 2010 surveys.
12	Indiana's Medicaid Agency has several different programs only one of which is a 1915b managed care program. The majority of mental health services for persons with serious mental illness or serious emotional disturbance are provided through a Medicaid fee-for-service program.
15	Increased number of persons in jails during the year is probably more accurate than in previous years since providers improved reporting reassessment information which includes the living arrangement.
16	Decreased number of persons receiving supported housing and supported employment services during the year is due to providers not providing EBP data to the new system. Monitoring of missing data elements has been implemented.
17	Decreased number of persons receiving IDDT and IMR during the year is due to providers not providing EBP data to the new system. Monitoring of missing data elements has been implemented.
	Surveys completed may include some persons not classified as SMI or SED that are being seen by the local provider but not considered part of the SMHA population. These persons would constitute not more than 3% of all respondents.
