6	The state psychiatric facility has focused primarily on continuity of care and working closely with community mental health center staff playing an important role in discharge planning and assisting individuals to remain in the community rather than facing a hospitalization. This is why we see such a decrease in the numbers related to average length of stay.
14 A and B	State definition of SPMI: The consumer's severe and persistent emotional, behavioral, or psychological disorder causes the consumer to meet at least one of the following criteria: (a) The consumer has undergone psychiatric treatment more intensive than outpatient care and more than once in a lifetime, such as, emergency services, alternative residential living, or inpatient psychiatric hospitalization; (b) The consumer has experienced a single episode of psychiatric hospitalization with an Axis I or Axis II diagnosis per the DSM-IV-TR as defined in § 46:20:01:01; (c) The consumer has been treated with psychotropic medication for at least one year; or(d) The consumer has had frequent crisis contact with a center, or another provider, for more than six months as a result of a severe and persistent mental illness; and(2) The consumer's severe and persistent emotional, behavioral, or psychological disorder meets at least three of the following criteria: (a) The consumer is unemployed or has markedly limited job skills or poor work history; (b) The consumer exhibits inappropriate social behavior which results in concern by the community or requests for mental health or legal intervention; (c) The consumer is unable to obtain public services without assistance; (d) The consumer requires public financial assistance for out-of-hospital maintenance; (e) The consumer lacks social support systems in a natural environment, such as close friends and family, or the consumer lives alone or is isolated; or(f) The consumer is unable to perform basic daily living skills without assistance.
14 A and B	State Definition of SED: Severe emotional disturbance defined. An individual with a serious emotional disturbance is an individual who: (1) Is under eighteen years of age; or is between 18-21 years of age having received services prior to the age of 18.(2) Exhibits behavior resulting in functional impairment which substantially interferes with, or limits the individual's role or functioning in the community, school, family, or peer group; (3) Has a mental disorder diagnosed under the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fourth edition revised, 1994; (4)Has demonstrated a need for one or more special care services, in addition to mental health; and (5)Has problems with a demonstrated or expected longevity of at least one year or has an impairment of short duration and high severity. For purposes of this section, mental retardation, epilepsy, other developmental disability, alcohol or substance abuse, brief period of intoxication, or criminal or delinquent behavior do not, alone, constitute serious emotional disturbance.
15	The number of individuals in foster care, residential care, and institutional settings dropped 146 individuals from last fiscal year. Possible reasons for this include improved focus on development of systems of care for individuals and families receiving community mental health services. The number of adults reporting homelessness increased between last year and this year. Possible explanations may revolve around the downturn in the economy, and the system serving more individuals facing homelessness as an issue. Additionally, the number in institutional settings increased by approximately 74 individuals. In South Dakota, institutional settings refer to nursing homes. When comparing the data-it appears that the majority of the additional individuals were over 65-which could explain this increase.
17	For the past several years, the Division of Mental Health reported Serenity Hills Program as evidence based practice. Serenity Hills was the only residential facility of its kind, providing integrated mental health and substance abuse services. After review of the Serenity Hills program, it was determined they were not meeting fidelity to the evidence based practice. Therefore, the Division of Mental Health has removed them from our list of evidence based practices, as was previously reported to CMHS. However, as community mental health centers are improving the delivery of integrated treatment, individuals with co-occurring issues are able to receive services within their own community, rather than having to move to an unfamiliar service provider to receive the services they need/want. The Division is hopeful that this shift in philosophy and service delivery provides a more welcoming, respectful and hopeful atmosphere for individuals and families receiving services. As a result of removing this program as evidence based, the numbers served will drop to zero by FY2011.
