Table 2A & 2B	The number of MH clients served increasing from 2009 to 2010 is due to the Pierce region, where race break-outs for clients in the Pierce region for 2009 are all "not available". The data element then was not collected in the Pierce region in 2009.
4 & 4A	WA State collects two types of data on mental health services: encounters and non-encounters. Encounters record the actual services provided to clients. Non-encounters are demographics, outcomes and episodes of specific treatment and authorization, and quasi-outcome measures such as employment, education, living situation, etc. (we call them "consumer periodics"). We do not collect "periodic" data on clients discharged from inpatient stays, and therefore would not have employment data on those clients if they were not served in any community outpatient setting.
5A & 5B	The total number of consumers with both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid funding has increased from FY 2009 to FY 2010. The number of Medicaid eligible citizens in our state has increased by 225,000 from FY2009 to 2010. While the ratio of people eligible to those served in both years has remained steady at 11%, given the increase in the number of eligible persons, the number of people served has increased and we have seen an increase in the types of service in 18 of our state plan modalities for mental health care
Table 8	The increase in "MHA Technical Assistance Activities" is due to a decrease in "MHA Activities Other Than Those Above" as well as an increase in non-direct service activities that were sponsored by the WA State.
Table 10	WA State contracted directly with providers in Pierce County in 2009 because there was no managed care organization that covered that county. In 2010, there was again a managed care organization in place that the state directly contracted with. Therefore, the number of agencies directly receiving block grant funds from the state are smaller than that reported in 2009.
Table 11a	Hispanics counts were done by different sources and the format of the data were different between 2009 and 2010. Hispanics were counted within the races that they fit and separately as an ethnicity in 2009. In 2010 they were counted only as ethnicities and were not included within their corresponding race.
14A & 14B	Because the total counts of African American in Table 2A has increased by 24% comparing to SFY 2009, we feel the counts for SFY 2010 are an accurate reflection of the data. We saw in an increase of 12,500 African-Americans eligible for Medicaid in SFY 2010, compared to 2009. We also saw an increase of 2000 more African-American consumers served in 2010 compared to 2009. It seems reasonable to us that there would be a concomitant increase in the numbers of African Americans served that are SMI or SED
15	We saw a 3% drop in the number of people served in community mental health centers in SFY 2010, compared to 2009. We also saw a 3% increase in the number of people served in Jails or Correctional Facilities, along with increases in people served in other non-CMHC locations. SFY2009 included the second half of the calendar year 2008, which was the period where all encounters were used by an actuarial firm to set new Medicaid rates. Some of the disparities found in the rate study included how providers were coding the location of services. We suspect that this increase in counts of people served in Jail or Correctional Facilities is actually a change in coding practice, towards more accuracy. Some providers base their staff in jails and prisons and provide services there, in an effort to engage people into treatment upon release. Some state funds are used to provide these services, but distinct counts of clients served across the two fiscal years includes both Medicaid and Non-Medicaid clients, and the shift in coding practice was across all clients served, not just those with Medicaid
Table 16, 17	There were more providers participating in EBP survey than 2009. Therefore, the numbers of clients served increased. However, collecting this information via a Provider Survey limited the amount of individual-level client data that could be collected. Therefore, we don't have any of the demographic breakouts and we don't know for sure if the clients who received these services are seriously mentally ill or seriously emotionally disturbed. Also, we cannot answer any of the questions about implementation - all of our responses would be "don't know" at this time. However, when we are able to assess this information in the future it would be helpful to have a response option that allowed for some providers implementing using toolkit and some implementing without.
