4	AMHD - The differences between FY2017 and FY2016 are due to three factors. First, fewer people were served in FY2017 than FY2016 (n = 7479 vs n = 7684). Second, fewer data were available from consumers on employment status in FY2017 versus FY2016 (not available 2017 = 5490 vs not available 2016 = 4981). Third, this latter problem is related to a corrupted data format in the system used to collect this information from consumers served at contracted providers. Specific fields were located in an inconsistent fashion within data records thus making it impossible to ascertain their reference items.
4	CAMHD – The change in registration process (spurred by current transition to new IT system) has resulted in a slight difference in definition as well as better reporting of Medicaid Status. In the past, on SMHA registration forms, care coordinators would report on Medicaid eligibility of the family, which was what was reported in URS. However, this data was not consistently entered. Currently, the definition of Medicaid status for URS reporting is based on whether or not youth are considered “MedQuest enrolled,” which is a more consistently completed indicator of family Medicaid status, because some type of enrollment status is required to be selected.

6	CAMHD - For children's data, a different method was used this year. There is no indicator of admit and discharge in procured services; we are only able to estimate with billing data within the year. For in-home services, the first billing record of the year is considered the date of admission if there were no billing records in the prior 60 days, and the last billing record is considered the date of discharge if there were no further records for 60 days. These timeframes have been deemed acceptable cutoff points based on previous examinations of data.
15	CAMHD - For children's data, we are transitioning from capturing monthly living situation to capturing it at enrollment, discharge and (in-between) periodic enrollment updates. Currently, we are in a transition period where we are capturing it in all of these ways, so data may be inconsistent for a couple of years. AMHD - There are more people for whom data were not available in FY2017 than FY2016 (6717 vs 6024) while at the same time there are fewer consumers overall (9915 vs 10117).
16	AMHD - employment discrepancies: there are two factors contributing to these discrepancies. First, these services are provided by contracted providers. The MIS system used to track their services was changed mid-year. There appears to have been some data lost in the transfer process.
