16 & 17	Michigan Fidelity Assistance Support Team (MIFAST) - Overall Purpose of MIFAST: To ascertain the degree to which an evidence based program has been implemented and functioning for both fidelity and efficacy. As the result of a MIFAST visit, agencies/teams will be able to have an outside perspective of how their EBP is being implemented, and where internal focus can be prioritized for improvement activities. In addition, cumulative information from visits provide a way for the state to see where needs may be in terms of support for improving practices and providing technical assistance across the system. No state staff are part of the initial MIFAST visit, however are the primary person to directly provide post-visit technical assistance, materials, training or further development, consultation, or coaching depending on needs identified during the visit itself. Generally, MIFAST visits are conducted every two years. Depending on available capacity, number of projects within each evidence-based program, and the number of teams available, prioritization may occur where exemplary reviews may result in a re-visit in three years and poor reviews may result in a re-visit in one year. Process for Developing MIFAST: (1) Announcement made at Performance Improvement Steering Committee (PISC) to members noting specific EBP focus area needing MIFAST team established. (2) Develop Workgroup from interested members: (a) Workgroup will develop process for evaluating fidelity to the EBP based on the model; (b) Select and invite other people from network who are known experts in EBP and will be able to assist the process as reviewers, consultants and trainers (be inclusive of peers when possible). (3) Conduct training on the instrument that will guide the MIFAST review visit: (a) Use of a standardized tool, for example SAMHSA Self-Assessment toolkits; Fidelity Bating tools developed by the EBP authors; or tool developed by workgroup; (b) Conduct Inter-rater reliability between reviewers as part of training; (c) Test tool through
16 & 17	For reasons explained in note for tables 12, 14A/B, and 16, the number of SMI and SED consumers reported for this current year is 38% higher than reported the previous year. Given this we would expect the number of SMI and SED consumers receiving EBPs to increase at the same percentage. However, this increase did not occur and in some instances as with consumers receiving IDDT, the number of consumers receiving the EBP has dropped. In general, agencies are having more and more difficulty getting/maintaining clinicians, which is impacting overall service provision and the ability to provide EBP services.
9, 11, 19A, & 19B	Michigan did not implement the MHSIP and YSS surveys during 2018. Michigan's Quality Improvement Council is reviewing new approaches for the evaluation of consumer satisfaction for individuals with SMI and SED. The council will determine what populations to include in the next survey and whether the state should implement a different set of surveys.
20A	In 2016, the funding for state psychiatric inpatient shifted from the local community mental health agencies to the state. This shift resulted in a decrease in complete and accurate reporting. Michigan is developing an improved process for reporting state psychiatric inpatient stays.
