As the result of a MIFAST visit, agencies/teams will be able to have an outside perspective of how their EBP is being implemented, and where internal focus can be prioritized for improvement activities. In addition, cumulative information from visits provide a way for the state to see where needs may be in terms of support for improving practices and providing technical assistance across the system.
