With possible changes to this Act this policy will be reevaluated.
6	The decrease in total number of Consumers Served in Community Programs at the beginning of the year: In the beginning of 2016, with the start of the ACA, DPBH started referring low risk clients to outside agencies so clinicians could focus at the more "At Risk" population. Less referral was made in our rural communities and in the northern communities. This 41% drop in consumers at the beginning of the year was expected.
6	The increase in total Admissions to Community Program During the Year: At the start of the above-mentioned program, the percentage of referrals peaked during the FY2016. The second year the number of outside referrals decreased causing the number of admissions to increase. This decrease allowed the program to be evaluated for its effectiveness and concerns over possible changes to the Affordable Care Act.
6	The increase in total Admissions to Residential Treatment Centers During the Year: An increase in staffing thus allowing more admissions as compared to 2016 as well as the reduction in acute bed availability lead to an increase in the use of the DCFS residential facilities (treatment homes) . The impact of the reduction of specialized foster care beds in the community also may have resulted in the increased use of the facilities. Some of the youth who would typically have been treated in out of state residential facilities were also placed in the DCFS homes rather than higher levels of care.
6	The decrease in average LOS of children discharged from State Hospitals: Decrease in acute beds and the movement toward more community based services; The decrease of Average LOS of children (in facility <1 year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year: Less acute bed availability and System of Care movement toward lower levels of care as soon as possible.
8	The increase in Total MHBG Expenditures for Non-Direct Service Activities: the State increased costs to support the collection of data through the infrastructure. Also note that the line item that asked about funding to support partnerships, Community outreach, and needs assessments was not included in the previous year's table 8.
12	The increase in Percent of children/adolescents meeting Federal definition of SED: As the state focuses on a population with higher risk factors, the number of patients meeting the federal definition of SED will naturally increase. The increase in Percent of adults served by the SMHA with co-occurring MH/SA diagnoses: the states increased focus on those adult clients incurring higher risk factors has led to an increase in clients with co-occurring diagnoses.

20A	Our population had an increase in the Average LOS at time of discharge from 15 days to 28 days. This is an 87% increase in hospital LOS duration. This results in a more stable status of patients at time of discharge, which leads to a decrease in the readmission rate
