16	During SFY 2018 while monitoring monthly utilization data, CSOC became aware of significant decreases in the provision of MST services in two New Jersey counties – Essex and Camden. Designated staff CSOC reached out to each provider agency to determine the cause and assist in developing a plan of correction. In Essex County the MST provider agency had experienced a complete turnover in staff resulting in a loss of community engagement. The plan of correction for Essex County involves re-marketing the MST services. A community "Kick-Off" is being planned and will include the courts, juvenile justice agencies, families, all partners within the children's system of care including care management organizations, mobile response and stabilization services, family support organizations, CIACCs, education and other stakeholders. In Camden County, the MST provider agency reported difficulty in hiring due to what was perceived as insufficient salary by prospective employees. The MST provider agency met with CSOC and received approval for staffing reorganization. Salaries have been increased and CSOC continues to monitor staffing as well as provision of services.
