3, & 15A	A person who was served in both a community setting and inpatient setting was included in both rows. "Other psychiatric inpatient" includes psychiatric inpatient services provided to TennCare (Medicaid) enrollees and to indigent patients through private psychiatric hospitals under contract with the TDMHSAS.
4 & 14	Employment and residential status updates are obtained after 6-months but before 7 months of last survey administered for TN's Community Survey System. For TN's Crisis Services System, updates are collected if there is more than one face-to-face encounter over the course of the reporting period.
5A	TennCare (Medicaid) data is provided at the aggregate level, not client level. This does not allow for the de-duplication of clients across TennCare and TDMHSAS systems. It is possible for people counted under TennCare to also be counted under TDMHSAS data systems. Clients receiving care at state hospitals may become eligible for TennCare (Medicaid) services during their stay, resulting in a reimbursement of TDMHSAS dollars.
6	In FY2018, we concentrated efforts to discharge patients with extended stays at Regional Mental Health Institutes into supportive community settings. The length of stays for these patients resulted in an increase in the overall length of stay.
7	Increase in FY2018 total state funds reflects increase in state expenditures for personnel in the Regional Mental Health Institutes due to raises and increases in community mental health funding. Total FY2018 administrative expenditures increased due to increased personnel costs due to raises and increase in cost of government services charged to the department.
10	In the Federal Fiscal Year 2018 appropriation, Congress increased the funding for the federal Community Mental Health Block Grant (MHBG). After soliciting input from Tennessee's Planning and Policy Council Executive Committee, leadership from community behavioral health centers, consumers, family organizations, and other key stakeholders, the Department released following funding announcements (i.e. Announcements of Funding/AOF) in FY2019 as a result of this increase: Intensive Long Term Support; School Based Behavioral Health Liaisons; First Episode Psychosis; Tennessee Move Initiative; and the Older Adults Program. Announcements for these programs have all been released and many proposals are under review at the time of this report submission. Additionally, these new funds are supporting the enhancement of the Recovery Within Reach/Housing Within Reach website, creation of an Anti-Stigma Campaign related to mental illness and crisis services, and increasing resources for targeted transitional support services. Peer support and supported employment services will also be enhanced as a result of these funds.

12,14A & 15A	TennCare employs an operational definition of SMI/SED based on ICD10 behavioral health diagnosis and a 15-month claims history to categorize individuals as having serious mental illness (SMI/SED). Substance abuse disorders (SUD) were based on the presence of a primary or secondary diagnosis of substance abuse disorder (ICD-10 section F10-F19: Disorders due to psychoactive substance use). Co-occurring diagnoses were based on a primary mental health diagnosis and a secondary substance use diagnosis.
14A & 15A	In March 2015, Crisis Services stopped collecting data on diagnoses. Data from TennCare (Medicaid); TDMHSAS Behavioral Health Safety Net; state psychiatric hospitals; and private psychiatric hospitals that contract with TDMHSAS, are included in these tables.
16	Twenty agencies reported in FY2017 and FY2018. One of those agencies was only able to report partial data due to a system change. There were six additional agencies that reported in FY2018 for a total of 26 agencies reporting. When estimating this metric for FY2017, only claims incurred in FY2017 were considered, which is incorrect. Any claims prior to (July 1, 2016) associated with readmissions in FY2017 should have been considered. Using this correct method, the TennCare readmission rate for FY2017 should have been 34.5% which is similar to the FY2018 180-day readmission rate.</p>
