In both 2018 and 2019 ,the State expended the total MHBG allocated amount. The increase in expenditures reflects changes in the awarded grant. The increase in Local Fund expenditures reflects an increase in paid cash accounts at the Arkansas State Hospital. The decrease in other expenditures is related to patient collections, then expenditures. Possibly patients can't pay due to COVID. SFY 2019 increase in EBP for ESMI expenditures was due to the related implementation of the PASSEs for Medicaid.
14A	The State's largest center saw a decrease of 10% (over 300 clients). Three facilities saw minor increases. Eleven of the fifteen agencies saw a decrease in clients. In addition, the State has been implementing an agency wide Behavioral Health Transformation. The decrease of clients with SMI/SED and specific services reported on the URS tables can be attributed to a new service structure that provides consumers with these services in the PASSE (Provider-Lead Arkansas Shared and Savings Entity) system rather than the block grant funded Community Mental Health Centers.
15	For the last couple of SFYs, the State has been implementing an agency wide Behavioral Health Transformation. Part of this is to place a higher priority on serving consumers in Jails.
16	The increase in the total number of adults receiving supported housing services is due to increases in service at three agencies. The first went from housing 140 clients last year to 248 this year. The second was a new agency opened this year, seeing 65 clients. The third agency went from 46 to 108 clients.
17	The increase in the number of clients receiving family psychoeducation services is due to one agency increasing the family psychoeducation services by 50 clients, and 4-5 other agencies seeing increases of 6-12 patients. The increase in integrated dual diagnosis treatment is due to a second facility seeing an increase of almost 200 patients. The increase in the total number of clients receiving medication management services is due to one facility substantially increasing its Medication Management caseload.
