4	Increases in the number of consumers employed and not in the labor force are due to change in internal methodology for this year's URS table calculation. Last year only employment status at admission was used for this table. This year, employment status at admission and at discharge were used. We preferred to use employment status at admission, but if the consumers did not have employment status at admission and had employment status at discharge, then employment status at discharge was used.
6	Due to Covid-19 pandemic, our state hospitals did not have many admissions or discharges from middle of March to end of June, 2020. There were a total of 28 admissions between March to June of 2020, compared to a total of 192 admissions for the same period in 2019. So the impact of COVID-19 pandemic accounts for 32% less admission in 2020. The reduction in Average LOS of adults (in facility < 1 year) who were state hospital residents at the end of the year was due to two reasons. First was the reduced number of admissions during March-June of 2020 due to COVID-19 pandemic (stated above, and also presented in the table below). The second one was due to the difference in average LOS before and after the pandemic. The consumers admitted before COVID pandemic had longer Average Length of Stay (in Days), than consumers admitted after COVID pandemic. From March-June of 2019, 158 consumers were admitted to the hospital who ended up staying less than one year. This figure for March-June of 2020 was 27. For all of 2019, 323 consumers stayed in the facility for less than one year. This figure for 2020 was 239.
7	The increase in total Medicaid expenditures is due to the annualization of the 52 new civil beds at ELMHS with 117 new TO which increased the Uncompensated Care funding and increase in the per diem of the ICF/MR beds at ELMHS. The increase in total other fedreal funds exependitures is due to the supplemental appropriation of the CARES Act. Louisiana now includes the state portion of all Medicaid expenditures that is used in the Maintenance of Effort calculations which accounts for the increase in total state funds expenditures. The decrease in total other expenditures is due to the decrease in patients having private insurance. The increase in total other 24-hours care expenditrues is due to the annualization of the new 20 community beds at ELMHS. Louisiana now includes the state portion of all Medicaid expenditures that is used in the Maintenance of Effort calculations resulting in an increase in the total ambulatory/community non-24 hour care expenditrues.
8	The state placed an emphasis on training and workforce development in FY 20. Therefore, additional funds were budgeted for the Training and Education category, as well as the Partnerships, Community Outreach, and Needs Assessment category. Furthermore, additional funds were budgeted for the hiring of staff to support the Cest Bon Program.

12	Per our internal research following edit check comments, we found out that total number of children served with Co-occurring MH/SA diagnoses did not have a marked change between FY 2020 (5,644) and FY 2019 (5,358). However, there were fewer children reported with drug or alcohol-related problems in the Co-Occurring cohort (822 in FY 2020 vs. 1,474 in FY 2019), that resulted in higher percentage change. LA SMHA interprets the reduction in drug or alcohol-related problems in the 0-17 SED cohort as positive trend.
17	Medication Management services only applied to the consumers who are 18 or above. Total consumers who were 18 or above with SMI in FY2020 was 10,898. Total consumers who were 18 or above with SMI in FY2019 was 11,681. This decrease in number of adult consumers with SMI partially contributed to decrease in total number of consumers receiving Medication Management Services. The 734 person count for Receiving Medication Management is based on Louisiana's Local Governing Entity (LGE) submitted data. This Med Mgmt. is not simply medication prescription administration, this Evidence Based Program (EBP)-type includes (at a minimum) utilization of a treatment plan that specifies outcomes for each medication including tracking and measuring outcomes using standardized instruments to inform treatment decisions. Most of the LGEs and their contracted providers choose other EBPs (e.g. Cognitive Behavioral Therapy-CBP) as opposed to Medication Management, and the CBP is not a reported category under MH-TEDS.
