12	Due to staff changes a different identification method and definition was used to identify COD which may accounts for the decrease in the percent of adults with co-occurring MH/SUD. A new EHR with better diagnosis data entry and reporting was used to report the percent of children with co-occurring MH/SUD. This year's data is more accurate than it has been in the past. COVID-19 has had an impact as well.
14A	We believe the increase in the number of Native Hawaiians/Other Pacific Islander and multi-racial clients it is due to clients identifying with additional races in both Adult and Children divisions.
15	The decrease in number of consumers living in Private Residence is due to fewer QOLI being submitted and completed.
16	There has been a change in how discharges are recorded with CAMHD new EHR to be more explicit so there are no longer youth incorrectly showing as active. The current year's data is accurate.
