5A/5B	In previous years, State of Maine has been unable to report Non-Medicaid Funding; this year OCFS was able to include the number of children served by State General Funded contracts. We do not have access to private insurance information.
6	OBH did not have access to requested data for this table in prior years, due to enhanced reporting capabilities in 2020 we are now able to provide the data.
7	Funding from MHBG increased as did the ability for providers to more fully expend their contract allocations within the grant period. Change in state expenditures is largely due to the fluctuation in expenditures related to the State Hospital. Although there were year-to-year changes in other activity areas, this large change is primary due to the State Hospital activity. Other Expenditures – the \$370,771 reported Other expenditures on the prior year report was done so in error and should have been included within the State Expenditures. This was resolved on this year's report. State Hospital expenditures for this Activity include RPC and DDPC. OBH does not manage the hospital budgets, however both state and federal expenditures fluctuate quite significantly year-to-year in looking at a historical trend. The majority of the other 24-hour care expenditures are related to the State's Medicaid Seed accounts; these are MaineCare related expenditures that are not monitored through an OBH contract. These expenditures make up most of this activity area. There was a fluctuation in State Funds which was due to a slightly increased baseline budget and OBH working with providers to ensure that allocations and revenues are being maximized. Administration—OBH & OCFS went through a period of time when the offices had several vacancies. With vacancies, an increase in IT costs, along with normal increases in rent and other general operating expenses—this is why there is an increase reflected.
7A	In SFY20 an addition to the contract was to report out the expenditures for Training and Planning Practices.
8	The modification that increased the Total Block Grant and the FEP in the amount on Table 10 was, on the previous filing, reported on Table 8 as non-direct service resource development activity when it should have been reported as direct service.
9	There was an increase in MaineCare members diagnosed with substance use disorder, which is likely attributed to MaineCare expansion which broadened the amount of members served significantly, resulting in an increase in individuals receiving treatment.
12	OCFS obtained access to youth SUD data for SFY20, We have not had access previously. We are attributing the increase in co-occurring MH with SUD to COVID and Medicaid expansion allowed individuals who were affected by SUD to recognize they were also eligible for Mental Health services.
