The average length of stay of children in the state hospitals less than a year was longer in SFY 2020 because there were almost double the amount of children than in SFY 2019 and there was a greater pool of consumers staying longer.
7	A lack of MHBG primary prevention expenditures, which was \$822k in 2019, is the main reason for the rest of the decrease. Total Primary Prevention Expenditures - The amount reported in 2019 was for a suicide prevention contract funded from MHBG. The 2020 suicide prevention contract was funded by a grant from Lifeline (Vibrant), not from MHBG. Total State Hospital Expenditures - State hospital expenditures decreased from 2019 to 2020 due to reduced intake of Medicaid-eligible patients and underspend of state-appropriated funds. Also a new hospital replaced an old hospital in 2019 and this caused a lag in overall patient population, which was still ramping up in 2020. Total Other 24-Hour Care Expenditures - This increase was caused by Medicaid expenditures for inpatient psychiatric care increased by \$10M+ from 2019 to 2020; Psychiatric residential treatment facility expenditures increased by \$2M+ in the same period. It is unknown why both categories experienced higher costs in 2020.
8	Total MHBG Expenditures for Non-Direct Service Activities - In 2020 more MHBG resources were devoted to non-direct service categories Infrastructure Support and Partnership/outreach/needs assessment.
