16A	What fidelity measure do you use: we are using the fidelity measures that were used in the RAISE ETP trial. We are measuring fidelity for the following roles: FE, IRT, SEE, prescriber and team. 16A	Who measures fidelity: fidelity is measured differently depending on the role on the team. Taped sessions are rated for fidelity for the FE and IRT roles, SEE specialists enter monthly data into a data system that will be used to measure fidelity, and the prescriber sends in data about prescribing patterns that is assessed.
16A	How often is fidelity measure: we began assessing fidelity 9 months to 1 year after completion of the NAVIGATE training. The 3 programs have all completed fidelity as of 6-2020. We currently do not have plans to measure fidelity again.
