General	NH has been working on building capacity for SAMHSA MH-CLD reporting. The Phoenix System is the centralized database used by the state for reporting of eligible mental health clients and selected service utilization. From September 2020 through January 2021, the system is being enhanced to include additional data elements, as well as improve currently collected data elements. These changes will improve reporting as well as align the data with best practices outlined by CDC and CMS. These elements include: Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, Biological Sex, Language, Race, Ethnicity, Housing, Tobacco Use, Spoken Language, Written Language, and personal identifiers. Once these changes are implemented in the system, NH will work to onboard Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) and validate their monthly data submissions through July 2021. During the validation period, NH plans on updating all previous data queries utilized in SFY20 data reporting to include new options and will validate findings with this submission file (since the state will be required to submit results in both the MH-CLD and URS Table formats for SFY21). The state will then begin reviewing documentation surrounding MH-CLD reporting supplied for SFY20 to prepare for SFY21 submissions.
7	Effective State Fiscal Year 2020, New Hampshire Hospital (the State psychiatric Hospital) began to recognize Disproportional Share Hospital (DSGH) funds as "intra-governmental", as it was discovered that both the NH-DHHS Office of Medicaid Business Policy (OMB) and NHH were reflecting these DSH funds as being Federal funds. As a result, OMPB now recognizes the receipt of the Federal Financial Participation (FFP) from DSH as federal income and NHH recognizes that payment as inter-governmental. This account for the variance between SFY 2019 and SFY 2020 data as it has been relegated to state or federal funds. For SFY 2019, we engaged in infrastructure and planning efforts that involved contracting with experts in First Episode Psychosis and collecting information from peers and providers. This resulted in block grant funds in excess of the 10% set aside being expended.
