

2021 Uniform Reporting Summary Output Tables Executive Summary

State Mental Health Agencies (SMHAs) compile and report annual data as part of their application package for SAMHSA's Community Mental Health Block Grant. These compiled data constitute the Uniform Reporting System (URS).

The URS is comprised of 21 tables that are developed by SAMHSA in consultation with SMHAs. The 2021 URS Output Tables present findings from 59 states and U.S. territories. Each output table provides summary information on the SMHA clients served in 2021: sociodemographic characteristics of clients served, outcomes of care, use of selected evidence-based practices, client assessment of care, insurance status, living situation, employment status, and readmission to state psychiatric hospitals within 30 and 180 days. Key data highlights are listed below:

- In 2021, 8,195,517 clients received SMHA services from 59 states. This is an increase from 8,013,396 SMHA clients in 2020. There were 5,789,234 adults (or 17.3 per 1,000), 2,175,848 children (or 29.9 per 1,000) served. About 9,311 (0.1 percent) clients were missing age data.
- Among SMHA clients, there were 4,342,545 (53.0 percent) females served while there were 3,806,666 (46.4 percent) males served. In 21 states and U.S. territories, more SMHA males were served than females. While in 38 states and U.S. territories, more SMHA females were served.
- The age distribution among SMHA clients was the largest among ages 25-44 with 32.9 percent, followed by ages 45-64 with 23.6 percent, children ages 0-12 with 14.8 percent, and children ages 13-17 with 12.1 percent.
- The highest percentage of SMHA clients that were served was among the White population with 58.1 percent, followed by Black or African Americans with 17.9 percent, and only 15.7 percent for Hispanics.

In past years, MHBG staff had lumped all expenditures for "Psychiatric Inpatient Care" in the "Other 24-Hour Care" category. For the 2021 tables, we took the opportunity to break out these expenditures appropriately. That is why the "Other 24-Hour Care" expenditure category appears to show a significant decrease from the prior year. When the "Psychiatric Inpatient Care" and "Other 24-Hour Care" categories are added in the 2021 table, the total expenditures are similar to the figures provided in the 2020 tables (i.e. the variation between years becomes much smaller). Going forward, these expenditure categories will always be calculated separately, as done in FY 2021. Our understanding (based on the grant periods of 7/2018 to 6/2019 and 7/2019 to 6/2020) is that Total Administration Expenditures increased, because we underwent the DHCS Behavioral Health Reorganization, which resulted in a larger number of DHCS personnel being assigned to working on MHBG.
14A	Total Number of Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders increased from the 2020 report year to the 2021 report year, because data for Santa Clara was missing from the 2020 report. Santa Clara County has a large percentage of this ethnic group. The 2020 edit report asks why Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders decreased from 2019. Now that Santa Clara is reporting again, the numbers in the 2021 report look a lot closer to the numbers in the 2019 report.
16	Supportive Housing has increased because several counties have added to their programs in recent years. Functional Family Therapy has decreased due to the Covid outbreak.
20A	Readmissions declined due to the Covid outbreak.
