

## 2024 Uniform Reporting Summary Output Tables Executive Summary

State Mental Health Agencies (SMHAs) compile and report annual data as part of SAMHSA's Community Mental Health Services Block Grant Report requirements. These compiled data constitute the Uniform Reporting System (URS).

The URS is comprised of 25 tables that are developed by SAMHSA in consultation with SMHAs. The 2024 URS Output Tables present findings from 59 states and U.S. territories.

Each output table provides summary information on the SMHA clients served in 2024: sociodemographic characteristics of clients served, outcomes of care, use of selected evidence-based practices, client assessment of care, Medicaid funding status, living situation, employment status, crisis response services, and readmission to state psychiatric hospitals within 30 and 180 days. Key data highlights are listed below:

- In 2024, 7,945,185 clients received SMHA services from 59 states and U.S. territories/jurisdictions. This is a reduction from 8,220,399 clients served by the SMHAs in 2023.\*
- There were 5,730,557 adults (or 21.9 per 1,000), 2,212,116 children (or 30.4 per 1,000) served. Age data was missing for 2,512 (<0.1 percent) clients served.
- Among SMHA clients, there were 4,165,971 (52.4 percent) females served while there were 3,684,256 (46.4 percent) males served. In most states (38), more females were served than males, and in the remaining states (21), more males were served than females.
- The age distribution of SMHA clients served was the largest among ages 25-44 with 33.2 percent, followed by ages 45-64 with 21.7 percent, children ages 13-17 with 12.9 percent, and children ages 6-12 with 12.2 percent.
- Over half of SMHA clients served were White, comprising the largest racial category at 56.0 percent; Black or African American clients comprised the next largest group with 17.6 percent. Race data was missing for 12.5 percent of clients served. When looking at ethnicity, the majority of SMHA clients served were non-Hispanic (67.8 percent), while 15.1 percent were Hispanic.

The Medicaid Authority in the State of Illinois continues to make adjustments in how MCO claims are processed. As an example: In FY17, the SMHA processed claims for 64,403 individuals and the MCOs processed claims for an additional 64,066 for a combined total individuals served in the publicly funded mental health system of 128,469 in FY17.
2A	The SMHA has been working with the State Medicaid Authority (SMA) to get access to MCO covered individuals. However, the effort has not produced the matches to the data collected from the SMHA. The state is continuing to analyze the integrity of the data to produce results that could be reported.
7A	BSCA increased compared to last year because IL started expending funds. The team who had been working on it in 2023 experienced turnover, so the work didn't officially begin until 2024. The state received an increase in BG funds which was used to increase spending. Increase was primarily in Personnel, ESMI, and Crisis Services (which the state did not have any expenditures for in FY23), and due to a continued increase in demand. The state recategorized select funds which caused increases in some areas and decreases in others. There was a Legislative-driven increase to targeted rates within Medicaid which not only affected the State Hospitals, but also increased the expenditures for the Non-24 hour care.
7B, 7C	The increase in expenditures is due to an increase in demand and the number of providers for these services.
8	The increases and decreases are due to multiple factors: The state recategorized select funds which caused increases in total MHBG funds and BSC funds for non-direct service activities. BSCA expenditures increased due to beginning the work and expending funds in 2024 after experiencing turnover in 2023 in the team that was originally working on it.
12	Providers update information every 12 months and the SMHA does not control what is submitted.
9,11,11A	The FY2024 MHSIP Surveys have not yet been conducted. As of mid-March 2020 all DMH offices were closed and Central Office employees have been working remotely from home. The survey has been completed annually by using a stratified random sample of all consumers and caregivers who had received services during the month of June. The mail survey has been completely produced, conducted and processed by DMH Central Office staff, which can only be done on site in the physical offices. In FY2019, surveys were mailed to approximately 4,500 individuals and over 450 responses were received. In FY2024, DMH staff have not been available to conduct the on-site activities required to produce, distribute and analyze the survey. The survey is considered a priority for immediate action upon staff returning to office. The process takes approximately 90 days so results should be available shortly after a return to almost normal conditions. DMH is currently exploring electronic and web-based approaches and methods to conducting the surveys and considering ways to streamline the survey process, make it less dependent on printing, mailing, fastidious data entry, and other clerical processes and still be able to obtain accurate results quickly.
16B	The information collected in this table is from an indicator in the registration process for state community providers. There is not any validation on it to make sure that a substance use diagnosis is included.
17	The numbers were based on the submitted Medicaid claims for each specific type of service. 24/7 Mobile Crisis Team was any claim submitted under Mobile Crisis Response and Mobile Crisis Response - Team. Crisis Stabilization was any claim submitted under Crisis Intervention or Crisis Stabilization. IL does not currently have an ability to determine percentage of coverage and/or availability. Callers into the call centers remain anonymous, unless they choose to provide demographic information. Thus, data on age is not a numerical data point that is collected and tracked.
