2024 Uniform Reporting Summary Output Tables Executive Summary

State Mental Health Agencies (SMHAs) compile and report annual data as part of SAMHSA's Community Mental Health Services Block Grant Report requirements. These compiled data constitute the Uniform Reporting System (URS).

The URS is comprised of 25 tables that are developed by SAMHSA in consultation with SMHAs. The 2024 URS Output Tables present findings from 59 states and U.S. territories.

Each output table provides summary information on the SMHA clients served in 2024: sociodemographic characteristics of clients served, outcomes of care, use of selected evidence-based practices, client assessment of care, Medicaid funding status, living situation, employment status, crisis response services, and readmission to state psychiatric hospitals within 30 and 180 days. Key data highlights are listed below:

- In 2024, 7,945,185 clients received SMHA services from 59 states and U.S. territories/jurisdictions. This is a reduction from 8,220,399 clients served by the SMHAs in 2023.*
- There were 5,730,557 adults (or 21.9 per 1,000), 2,212,116 children (or 30.4 per 1,000) served. Age data was missing for 2,512 (<0.1 percent) clients served.
- Among SMHA clients, there were 4,165,971 (52.4 percent) females served while there were 3,684,256 (46.4 percent) males served. In most states (38), more females were served than males, and in the remaining states (21), more males were served than females.
- The age distribution of SMHA clients served was the largest among ages 25-44 with 33.2 percent, followed by ages 45-64 with 21.7 percent, children ages 13-17 with 12.9 percent, and children ages 6-12 with 12.2 percent.
- Over half of SMHA clients served were White, comprising the largest racial category at 56.0 percent; Black or African American clients comprised the next largest group with 17.6 percent. Race data was missing for 12.5 percent of clients served. When looking at ethnicity, the majority of SMHA clients served were non-Hispanic (67.8 percent), while 15.1 percent were Hispanic.

7A, 7B, 7C, 8, 14C, 15	Late in this reporting iteration, MN-DHS became aware that historic reporting practices were no longer producing meaningful and valid outcomes regarding program utilization. Further, MN-DHS identified numerous gap areas. MN-DHS determined that the URS required more oversight to help inform decision making in the methodology and analysis of program utilization response rates reported in the URS. This oversight focused on improved reporting practices to enhance consistency, clarity, efficiency, and compliance. Although this process improvement resulted in outcome variance between this reporting iteration and last, variance in future reporting rates will stabilize.
16A	MN-DHS program managers for these areas were unable to be determined. Reporting rates for these program areas were done by a query from MMIS.
